Gates Cambridge Scholarship	Gates Foundation	Applicants from every country of world except the United Kingdom under age 30; an excellent academic record (3.7 or above), with experience in undergraduate research.	†October
Georgia Institute of Technology Goizueta Foundation	The Goizueta Foundation	U.S. citizens or permanent residents of Hispanic/Latino origin; incoming or current Ph.D. students	March

Marshall Scholarship	Marshall Scholarship	U.S. citizen who has received a Bachelor's degree by the time the award begins, is a senior or graduated no more than 2 years previously from undergraduate institution, and has a minimum GPA of 3.7. A successful applicant has an excellent academic record and has pursued undergraduate research, significant independent study projects, or other work related to intellectual interests, and has leadership ability. Mitchell Scholarship	US-Ireland Alliance	U.S. Citizens, between the age of 18 and 30; Bachelor's degree completed before beginning the scholarship; academic distinction, commitment to service, and potential for leadership.	†October
Rhodes Scholarship	Rhodes Trust	U.S. and many other citizenships. Bachelor's degree by the time the award begins; between ages of 18 and 24. GPA of 3.7 or higher and intellectual activities such as undergraduate research, internships, or independent study. Leadership ability is also required. Competitive candidates are well rounded in their interests and activities and have focused on one or more of their interests in some depth.	†October
Rotary Ambassadorial Scholarship	Rotary International	Must have completed at least two years of college when the scholarship begins; must be a citizen of a country in which there is a Rotary Club; lineal descendants (children or grandchildren) of Rotarian's and their spouses are ineligible.	March
Samuel Huntington Public Service Award	National Grid	Graduating seniors interested in one year of funds to serve anywhere in the world	February
SREB Doctoral Scholars Program	Southern Regional Education Board	An ethnic minority who is a U.S. Citizen and holds or will receive a bachelor's or master's degree from a regionally accredited college or university.	April
SREB Doctoral Scholarship Program: The Dissertation Year Fellowship	Southern Regional Education Board	Minority doctoral Scholars who have reached the dissertation stage and plan to become full-time faculty members upon completion of their doctoral program.	May
Truman Scholarship Program	Harry S. Truman Scholarship Foundation	U.S. Citizen. Junior level in the top 25% of class who have outstanding leadership potential, plan to pursue career in government or other public service(must work 3-yrs in public service after program completion) , and wish to attend graduate school. Scholarships are for graduate study.	†October

Udall Foundation	US Citizens who have outstanding potential and intend to pursue careers in environmental public policy OR Native American and Alaska Native students with outstanding potential who intend to pursue careers in health care or tribal public policy; Current sophomores or juniors; 3.0+ GPA.	†March
